Update	your CV

Make sure it has all your employment history, experience and key skills.

#### Tailor your CV

Tweak your CV to make the most relevant parts to the job you are applying for stand out.

#### Network

Ask people you used to work with, in the playground, neighbours or relatives if they know of jobs.

#### Take time on applications

Even the long ones, employers will decide if you are the right fit by reading them!

#### Stay resilient

Remember not to take it personally if you don't hear back about a job.
